# ORGANIZATIONAL IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVE

In April, several board members and congregants began taking a Congregational Governance course offered by the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ), scheduled to conclude at the end of June. The course focuses on best principles in leading a congregation.

Recently Freda and Dawn discovered that the content of the Governance course is very much aligned with what we had included in our scope for hiring a management consultant to assess our governance systems and structures. Specifically, the Governance course includes recommendations for board focus, transparency in communication with congregants, and for leadership development.

As a result, we have teamed up with several other members of our congregation who are also taking the Governance course to combine our efforts moving forward as a Governance Group. We are calling this effort the Organizational Improvement Initiative. (Yes, the acronym sounds like OY!) Together, we are becoming more and more aware of the ways we can make our Temple better.

Several months ago, we had asked several consultants to provide us with written proposals that included assessment of the Temple's governance and structure in a number of areas. Although we are still considering the value of a consultant, our belief is that, through our participation in this Governance course, we board members and congregants are learning more about ways we can improve our leadership, governance, and systems. We ourselves are coming up with recommendations for change and improvement.

As such, our plan, through the Organizational Improvement Initiative is to a) complete the URJ Governance course; b) prepare our own internal written assessment; c) identify what aspects were included on our original scope of work/request for proposals that are not being addressed by the Governance course; and d) refine how a management consultant may help us with the areas for improvement. At this point, our thinking is that the consultant we recommend will likely be an individual with experience and expertise in human resources. We know we need to firm up our organizational chart, personnel policies, and our procedures for contract renewals.

In the coming months, you will be provided with updates regarding this initiative. We will keep you informed through this column, and will also be convening additional Town Hall meetings to receive and share information. Our hope is that some of you will volunteer to participate in work groups to not only help us complete the internal assessment, but also to help us bring about these improvements.

As we move forward with the work ahead, we thank you for your support, patience and input. And if you see us around, just say OY!

**JILL GRANEK** 



# FOUNDATION BYLAWS - PROPOSED CHANGES

#### **Board Of Trustees**

According to the Temple Israel Long Beach Foundation Bylaws, "The Bylaws may be amended only by approval of the Board of Trustees and by Temple. The recommendation for such amendment shall be made first to the Board of Trustees and, if adopted, then to the Board of Directors not less than twenty (20) days prior to a vote upon such recommendation by the Board of Trustees and the Board of Directors at their respective meetings as applicable. Such recommended amendment shall be reported in the bulletin of Temple prior to the vote by the Board of Directors"

Following protocol, proposed changes to the Foundation Bylaws have been presented to the Temple Board of Directors at the April 30, 2019 meeting. Below are the significant areas of recommended ammendments to the Bylaws that will be voted on by the Temple's Board of Director's at their June 25 meeting. Links to all the changes in the Foundation Bylaws as well as a fully revised version are below.

#### **Main Areas of Ammendments:**

#### A. Nomination and Approval

The President of Foundation shall appoint three Trustees, none of whom is an officer of Foundation, as a "Nominating Committee" to nominate new trustees for three-year terms. The Board will vote on the nominated trustees, and final approval of the new trustees will be made by the Board of Directors of Temple Israel of Long Beach.

#### **D. Term of Office**

- 1. The term of office of a Trustee shall be for three (3) years.
- 2. The terms of the Trustees shall be staggered so that approximately one-third of the terms shall expire each year. No person shall serve more than six (6) consecutive years as a Trustee without an interruption in service for at least one (1) year.
- 3. A Trustee elected as an officer of the Board may serve additional one-year terms, if consecutive, even if such additional terms result in the Trustee's overall consecutive service on the board exceeding six (6) years. The maximum consecutive service time shall be eight (8) years.
- 4. The term of office of a Trustee shall commence on the first day of July in the year elected, excepting only those Trustees elected to fill vacancies on the Board of Trustees. The term of office of a Trustee shall expire on the last day of June of the last year of the term to which he/she was elected.

# TEMPLE ISRAEL HONORED BY URBAN COMMUNITY OUT REACH

At the 2019 annual fundraiser for the Urban Community Outreach (UCO), Temple Israel was a 2019 Honoree. Over 25 members of Temple Israel were in attendance as we received a Commendation from Supervisor Janice Hahn, a Certificate of Recognition from Representative Alan Lowenthal, and a 2019 Community Leadership Award from Long Beach Mayor, Dr. Robert Garcia.

Myron Wollin, Vice Chair of the Social Action Committee, accepted the honor for the Temple and said the following:

"I want to thank Reverend Elena Larssen, Senior Minister, First Congregational Church of Long Beach, for her fine introduction. The First Congregational Church has been a close friend of Temple Israel. We will never forget when the church opened its doors to our members for our High Holy Day services, and we needed a larger space for worship.

"On behalf of Temple Israel, I must say that we are honored to be recognized by UCO for our work with you. We have been sponsoring twice a year dinners at UCO to serve the surrounding community. We have helped prepare and serve the meals, and in addition have contributed clothing, toys and other items to be distributed. I must give thanks to all Temple Israel members who are here today for their work. I know that our members consider this work a mitzvah, a good deed, and find it part of our effort, as the Jewish faith commands us, *tikkun olam*, to heal the world.

"To fulfill this goal, our Temple has a commitment to social justice that our Temple leadership supports and is expressed in such activities as our joining the *b'rit olam*, the Jewish Reform Movement's vision of social justice, our collection of food for food pantries at our High Holy Day services, our leadership in organizing and staffing Make a Difference Day, and our recent hosting of a Climate Change Conference.

"We have been participating in sponsoring these dinners for over 20 years and I must acknowledge the Temple member who first organized this effort, Stephanie Bussi. To honor her work we call the dinners the Stephanie Bussi Memorial Dinners. And personally I am proud to continue her work these last four years and keep her tradition alive. As many will remember, she used a wheelchair. She never let her physical disability slow her down. She was an active member of Temple Israel, and she was a member of the Social Action Committee of the Temple. She always showed up for the dinners to make sure everything went well. She was a tireless worker for social justice in Long Beach. As a matter of fact I have discovered that another social justice organization in Long Beach, called Housing Long Beach, awards an annual Stephanie Bussi Leadership award and members of Housing Long Beach are present here today.

"We are honored to recognize members of Stephanie's family who are now here, and we pledge that her fine work will not be forgotten."



# INTERFAITH WORKERS JUSTICE DESSERT SEDER

On April 24, the Social Action Committee (SAC) and Clergy and Laity United for Economic Justice, (CLUE), hosted the fourth annual Worker Justice Dessert Seder at Temple Israel. Over 50 community and Temple members attended. Cantor Sara Hass led the service using a Hagaddah that was specially written by SAC and CLUE.

The Hagaddah included the traditional rituals such as the Seder plate, story of Passover, songs and prayers. At Passover we are commanded to imagine ourselves as though we personally went forth from Egypt, to imagine the experience of being victimized because of who we are, of being enslaved, and of being free. So we linked the fundamental story of the Jewish people who were freed from slavery with other contemporary struggles.

We included an orange on the Seder plate as a gesture of solidarity with LGBTQ Jews and a banana to remind us of the refugee crisis, and that welcoming the stranger is both an American and Jewish value. We sang the Negro spiritual Go Down Moses, which has a direct link to the Passover story, and which was sung during the U.S. Civil Rights movement as part of the culture of those brave men and women working for freedom, jobs and dignity.

After we recited the 10 plagues, we then recited some modern plagues of contemporary life such as hunger, sexism, racism, homelessness, anti-semitism and religious intolerance.

Port of Los Angeles/Long Beach truck drivers who are misclassified as contract workers and subject to wage theft then spoke of their experiences.

We encourage you to attend future Seders sponsored by your Social Action Committee.



Game Day on April 30 was a fun and exciting event at the temple with lunch and prizes. Over 40 women attended playing such games as Mah Jong and bridge.
