THE EAGLE HAS LANDED

The Alpert Foyer and halls of our Temple are quite often filled with people scurrying about. Congregants are attending services, teachers and children are heading to class in the Torah Center, volunteers are looking for the room their meeting is in, and all the above are anticipating the Joys of Jewish Learning event they came for. These activities are business as usual for all of us.

As president, I'm often stopped by these folks attending, and asked about various aspects of temple operations and activities. I do my best to answer questions, and if I cannot answer right then, I get back to them with an answer.

Over the past couple of months, there has been one question that has dominated conversation which I've been asked in person, over the phone, by email, and through text messaging. Now, please don't get me wrong, I encourage and welcome all questions. It pleases me when people want to know about things and are interested enough to ask. This particular question, clearly, is on everyone's minds, including my own. And it's a question that up until now, I have been unable to answer. Not because I *chose* not to answer, but because I simply didn't *have* the answer.

That question, of course, is, "When are we going to have our new Rabbi?" And up until now, when asked, I had to shrug my shoulders, lift my hands, scrunch up my face, and say I didn't know. Recently however, I've been al least able to honestly add that "We're close." Beyond that, I didn't have anything else to add. I could see the disappointment in people's eyes, and I personally shared that disappointment. They wanted to hear THE answer, and I wanted to give it.

Fortunately, that inability no longer exists. I am now beyond excited to announce that Rabbi Scott Fox has accepted our offer to be the next Rabbi at Temple Israel of Long Beach. He will start on July 1, 2020.

The process has been long and arduous, but I'm very proud of all the many talented volunteers that were so enthusiastically engaged in this process.

It all started on July 30th of last year when I bribed Anne Gundry and Vicki Scherwin with a cup of coffee to be co-chairs of the Settled Rabbi Search Committee. After careful consideration and consultation with each other, they agreed to work together and lead the committee. What they didn't know, and I can now disclose, is that I would have sprung for a muffin in addition to the coffee. The rest is history. Throughout the years, I have been part of many committees. Not once, however, have I witnessed the brilliance, professionalism, and superior insight that these two incredibly gifted women brought to the table. Appropriately enough, they were joined by eleven other very talented committee

members, chosen to represent various demographic groups within our congregation. Together, they became the Temple Israel Search Committee "Dream Team".

The committee reviewed resumes, evaluated candidates, and provided astute feedback as to who our next Rabbi should be. The next time you encounter a member of the search committee in the aforementioned foyer and halls, you might want to express a thank you and Mazel Tov! Please believe me when I tell you it is well deserved.

I would also like to give a shout out of thanks to all of you who participated in this process. I know I described this in my article last month, but it is to your credit that the sanctuary was filled during the candidate visits, and when we had our congregational meeting to vote. I sincerely thank you very much for your engagement. The feedback you provided served to strengthen the final decision of the search committee and board, and as a result of the 92.7% approval vote, it created a mandate for Rabbi Fox.

The word mandate, in and of itself, pleases me to be able to use in this context. It implies concensus and agreement among the congregation. It also creates momentum and excitement, two valuable characteristics to have when speaking of our new spiritual leader.

The final paragraph of my article last month referenced the new chapter just waiting to be written in the story of our Temple.

That chapter now has a title.

Once accepted on the board, requirements include:

- Attendance: Attending a minimum of 8 board meetings per year.
 Meetings are held the 4th Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m.
- Fiduciary: overseeing budgets, funds & assets.
- Promotion: Actively promoting our organization and supporting our staff.
- Service: serving on at least one committee with the goal of chairing a committee or sub-committee within two years of board membership.
- Greeting: acting as a greeter and/or Board Representative at Services a minimum of four times per year and at the High Holy Days.
- Support: Staying current with all personal financial commitments to Temple Israel.
- Fund Raising: Actively support fund-raising events of the Temple.

HIGH HOLY DAY REDUX

Months later I am still able to reflect on the meaningful services during High Holy Days this last fall. I have finally been able to read through the evaluations of the various days. We had 138 congregants return the online evaluations. These were very instructive as to seeing what was meaningful and liked and what needs some work. Of course, like anything, often comments were all over the board. I have tried to summarize trends and consensus in the

surveys.

The item with the most comments was about the Rabbi's sermon with 96 comments. These were overwhelmingly positive with only a handful of comments calling his sermon political and saying that politics have no place on the bimah. It was clear from the many comments that if, in a service which is promoting Jewish values, something some may consider political comes out this is acceptable (and for many desirable).

Interestingly the comments about why people chose early or late service mainly had nothing to do with the content of the service but were rather just life issues. A common reason for choosing early service was ease of parking and not arriving home late. The late service was often chosen because of work schedule and being able to start the fast later. One good suggestion was that car pools should be organized to help with distant parking issues.

71 people took the time to share what they liked best. Only 58 people mentioned what they would like to see changed. 10 of the 58 comments about what they would like to see changed was an answer similar to "nothing, liked it all".

Overall most evaluators rated the day highly through point values and comments. Most items had no rankings of less than expected (below 3 out of 5). The lowest ranked item was "During services WITH the full choir, the music enhanced my prayer experience." This low rank was because 12 of 138 people filling out the survey ranked this item below expected. The most commonly chosen number though for this same item was a 5.

When looking at the most common theme of constructive criticism it would be finding a better balance between the Rabbi, the Cantor, the choir by itself (without Cantor accompaniment), and participation by the audience with the musical part of the service (not being a passive audience "just" listening). There were many different single suggestions for making other parts of the day better including ideas like having classes to prepare for the HHD better, scattering shofar blowers around the congregation, bringing the candle for the 6 million to a place where all can see it, offering apples, honey, and challah for adults after Rosh Hashanah service, and many other good ideas.

Anyone who would like to discuss the survey more please talk

to me or email. Given my recent column on sacred partnership as well as the Rabbi's Jewish values sermon I remind everybody that we need to communicate with each other in a civil manner whether one on one, at a meeting, or even when commenting on a survey. What one says is so important but how it is said could wind up just being hurtful and negate the importance of what is trying to be said. Please always honor the congregation's sacred partnership. 

Our own Gene Lentzner (of blessed memory) died four days before CCEJ's 29th annual Interfaith/Intercultural Breakfast which he helped establish and which he and his wife, Ann, have underwritten all these years. Though this year's breakfast was tinged with sadness, it became a celebration of the life that Gene led and the legacy he left for us to continue. Recently he said "I thought that I could do something to stop discrimination, so I got involved. I think everyone in the community has the ability to contribute against inequality in America." And so, this February's event titled, "Building Relationships to Build Community" celebrated Gene in the way I'm sure he would have treasured - through the power of interfaith/intercultural diversity.

Keynote speakers, Taina Vargas-Edmond and Richie Reseda, shared their uplifting personal stories, explaining how incarceration negatively impacts both family and community. They co-founded Initiate Justice by and for incarcerated people, formerly incarcerated people, and people with incarcerated loved ones. I am certain that Gene would be in the forefront, leading us to act by following our Jewish values of tzedek, tzedek tirdof ~ justice, justice shall you pursue, which includes human rights as well as economic justice for the poor, the weak and the despised. How can we claim to love God and not be passionate about justice? Let us, in this new year, commit to living out our values. Both the CCEJ and the SCIC are here to help!




