



#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



#### COMMUNICATION

Happy May. Our congregation has been talking a lot about communication lately. Last month, we had two opportunities for the congregation to meet, provide their input and ask questions. As we move forward we will have focus groups to help us look at our mission, vision and values. Our annual congregational meeting will be on June 2. This is our annual meeting where we elect the new members to the board, adopt our budget for the upcoming

year and evaluate the year behind us and you will have the opportunity to submit your input as to what values you feel are most important for our community. I hope you will mark your calendar for this important congregational meeting. This will be another opportunity to keep our communication channels open.

During the last months some questions have arisen: "How do I know what is going on with the board?" "What information is available to me as a congregant?" "How do I communicate with the board thoughts, ideas, compliments, criticisms?" We are also hearing a lot of questions about our future: "What steps are we taking to secure a new Rabbi?" "What has the board/congregation learned from what happened?" This month's article will be dedicated to answering these questions.

"How do I know what is going on with the board?" The board meets 10 times a year. Our meetings are typically the fourth Tuesday of the month. Our meetings are open to congregational members. If you would like to be placed on the agenda you need to submit a request to the president one month prior. Your request will be reviewed by the executive committee and then, if approved, you will be placed on the agenda. When time allows, the president can allow a designated period during the board meeting for congregants to make statements without being on the agenda. These statements (or questions) will be limited in time and will be available on a first come/first serve basis. Our May board meeting is scheduled for May 30th. If you plan on attending it is helpful, but not required, that you let us know in advance so we can provide extra chairs. We will have time for statements and questions at the beginning of the meeting. For most of the last two years, I have provided a brief list in the Kol Israel, titled,"Board Bytes" This list highlights the major items the board has been working on from the previous months. The executive board (officers of the board and senior staff) also meet once a month to make preliminary decisions and decide on agenda items. The whole board (without staff) occasionally meets in "executive session" when personnel and contract matters are discussed. Both Executive board and executive session are not open to visitors.

"What information is available to me as a congregant?" The minutes of past board meetings, the reports submitted for those

meetings, the annual temple budget and quarterly budget forecasts are available upon request. Foundation board minutes are available to you. You may also request a copy of our employee manual and a copy of our current By Laws. All of these items can be obtained by emailing our Executive Director, Eric Shatzkin. Due to confidentiality, congregants do not have access to senior staff contracts.

"How do I communicate with the board thoughts, ideas, compliments, criticisms?" Board members are active in our building. You will find them at services, at JJL classes, Torah Study, fundraisers and at Torah Center. Board members try to always wear their badges when in the building. When you see them, say "hi" and start a conversation. We really want to hear from you. A list of current board members is in each Kol Y'Israel newsletter. Emails and phone numbers of board members are provided in the directory. Please feel free to send us your input at any time. If you have a concern, don't assume we have heard from someone else: let us know. Our board members are trained to pass your input onto the correct person, (personnel committee, VP's, senior staff). If you want your input to remain confidential, let the board member know and they will honor your request. The president email, President@tilb.org is a great email to add to your address book as it is transferred from one president to

"What steps we are taking to secure a new Rabbi?" An interim Rabbi search committee has been working extremely hard under the leadership of Past President Ron Feldman these last months. We have members representing quite a few of our key groups ( Board, past president, Torah study, Torah school parent, long time members, newer member, Jew by choice, and a teen). An applicant was submitted to the CCAR (Central Conference of American Rabbi's) and we received several strong candidates. Skype interviews were held, visits by top two choices were held (or will be soon). These visits gave us the opportunity to widen our group of people who were able to meet and give input about our candidates. Again we made a huge effort to gather representatives from all aspects of our temple, including our staff. Based on the input from this group and the committee the board will vote to approve the hiring of the Interim Rabbi. The Interim Rabbi will begin July 1. Interim Rabbis are specifically trained to work with congregations who are undergoing a (sometimes difficult) transition between "Settled" (permanent) Rabbis. Our Interim Rabbi will guide us through our transition year: aid us in healing; provide spiritual leadership; supervise/mentor staff; advise board; work directly with Torah Center students; attend to life cycle events and more. Our search for our new "settled" Rabbi will begin next month with much of the same format but expanded to include more opportunities for input from you, our congregation. The congregation will have the opportunity to vote to approve the final candidate. We will continue to keep you updated as to our progress as we move through the process. If you would like to be involved in the process please let me know.

"What has the board/congregation learned from what happened?" The importance of proper communication is key to what we have learned. Moving forward, the board is determined to do a better job of communicating with the congregation and giving more opportunities for input on an ongoing basis. Incoming President Steve Gordon, (he begins his term July 1) will let you know about his plans in the upcoming months. Rabbi Moskowitz expressed concerns that he feels we need to take a strong look at our systems and structures for our staff and for our board governance. We are doing several things to evaluate and make changes . Under the leadership of Freda Ross and Dawn Haldane, consultants are being evaluated to aid in this process. A task force will be formed to carry this work forward. In addition a group of leaders are currently attending an course conducted by the URJ on governance. Our incoming Interim Rabbi will also be able to offer support as we go through this self evaluation and re alignment process in the following year. Again, there will be opportunities for congregational input as we go along.

I feel open lines of communication will be crucial to preventing future misunderstandings. Communication all ways between the board and congregation. Communication all ways between the board and the senior staff. Communication all ways between the senior staff and the congregation. Let's continue to work together to further open these lines and keep them open.

May this month allow us to increase our communication among our sacred community and allow us to continue to support each other as we work to maintain the strong spiritual community we have built.

### BUILDING A COMMUNITY, ONE NAIL AT A TIME

Temple Israel is active in the Long Beach Area Faith Coalition for Habitat for Humanity. Our coalition partners include, but are not limited to, representatives from Methodist, Presbyterian, Lutheran, Latter Day Saints, Congregrational, Catholic and Muslim congregations.

The coalition's primary mission is to raise money for the home builds planned by Habitat for Humanity within the Long Beach area, and to bring together different faith communities to pool energies to help provide affordable housing to those in need in Long Beach.

The coalition raised \$150,000 to fund one of the four homes completed in August 2018 in the Washington Heights area off of Henderson Avenue, and so far has raised about 30% of the \$150,000 necessary to fund one of the 10 homes slated for the 14th Street- Pine/Pacific site.

Also, the coalition sponsors several build days per year. During this time together, participants often share spiritual beliefs and practices while working on projects such as painting, flooring, siding, and roofing. "These builds are always an example of ways different faith communities join together to express common tenets of community service for those in need," said Chris Untiet, Director of Faith Relations, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Los Angeles.

Many congregants from Temple Israel have enjoyed participating in these builds. Long time member Barry Mitnick said, "What a rewarding experience! Knowing that you are helping a deserving family become homeowners moving into their first home; coming together with other volunteers to make their dream a reality."

Adding to the experience, we sometimes meet and work with the future homeowners. They are required to put in "sweat equity" hours on homes and other projects as part of the purchase agreement with Habitat. They are always extremely thankful for any and all assistance, as they watch their new homes being built by volunteers.

Recently, Habitat for Humanity worked with cities to schedule builds on Sundays for Jewish organizations. For example, in February this year, Habitat successfully organized the first Sunday build for Wilshire Boulevard Temple in Los Angeles.

Opportunities for participation from Temple Israel congregants will be abundant since volunteers will be needed to construct the 10 homes at the 14th Pine and Pacific site beginning in late summer of this year. After that, 38 additional homes are planned at 1332 Locust for a total of 52 units in the Long Beach area.

During this construction, Habitat for Humanity plans to designate one day per month specifically for Long Beach coalition builds where 3 to 5 congregants participate from each congregation. The Social Action Committee is looking forward not only to recruiting congregants for these coalition builds but also will be sponsoring build days specifically for Temple Israel.

Trish and I returned recently from a trip to Israel, where we participated in Good Wheel 2019, a cycling and trekking fundraising journey through the northern Gallelli to benefit the Israel Sport Center for the Disabled (the ISCD and "Spivak" to the Israelis), located in Ramat Gan (Tel Aviv). The collections from the TI Tzedaka Box from March--which was Jewish Disability Awareness and Acceptance Month--were generously donated towards our fundraising goal for this event, as were direct donations made by numerous TI members, all of which helped Trish and I come close to doubling our initial goal (although no one will get angry if you still want to go to goodwheel.net and make a donation!).

Although the trip was somewhat about the cycling I did (we lost one day to rain, but got in over 150 miles over 3 days, during which I rode with many Israeli para-cycling champions and other athletes with disabilities), the hiking and exploring Trish did, the wonderful new friends we made, the incredible food and the amazing places we visited, at the beginning and at the end of the day, the trip was about getting to see first hand the magic that takes place at the ISCD--from watching the only woman play on their wheelchair rugby team, to seeing young children with CP learning to swim--and meeting, interacting with, breaking bread with and watching in action the athletes and their trainers and teachers who through their courage, commitment and hard work (often all coming after going through the many stages that a person facing adversity has traveled through, including denial, anger and fear) become the best person they each can be, oftentimes elite and sometimes even world class competitive athletes. That's why, instead of one of the many great biking, trekking or travel pics we took, I chose the picture below to convey both ours and the ISCD community's thank you for your support as it best represents why Trish and I went and why we are now even more committed to finding ways to support and interact with the ISCD and its US support arm, the American Friends of the ISCD, efforts which we hope to further engage the TI community in going forward. And, of course, everyone is invited to join me for Good Wheel 2020 in October, 2020. As they cheer for their athletes at the ISCD, "Go Spivak!"





#### **NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY**







Following the horrific massacre of Muslims in Christchurch, NZ, Temple Israel's Social Action Committee connected with ICLB and set up two events of support, one sheltering their Call to Prayer and another at their Family Night. The following are my dinner remarks to our sisters and brothers at the Islamic Center of LB on April 13, 2019.

Asalam mua'laikum, sisters and brothers. May peace be upon you...

Those of us who are representing our Temple Israel family, both tonight and also on March 29<sup>th</sup> when we were here to support and shelter you as you answered the Call to Prayer, have done so in peace and in friendship. Our message to you is simple and it is sincere. We want you, the members of the Islamic Center of LB, to know and to be sure that Temple Israel considers you as part of our family ... our sisters and brothers.

The evil that took place nearly 4 weeks ago in Christchurch, NZ has torn at our hearts and wounded our souls. We hold you in our hearts and we stand with you...not only during this painful time, but every day, in solidarity and in love ~ as sisters and brothers; as one family.

We have not forgotten that you stood with us when the misguided members of the Westboro Baptist Church held an anti-Jewish picket outside Temple Israel 9 years ago. Your love touched our hearts and helped push their hate away.

The longtime friendship between Temple Israel and your masjid, the Islamic Center of Long Beach, began when Imam Tarek and I began serving on the board of directors of the South Coast Interfaith Council (SCIC) together and has continued over these many years.

I also bring you words from Rabbi Jonah Dov Pesner, Director of Reform Judaism's Religious Action Center, when he uttered a call to action saying it is true that "liberation from the plague of bigotry" comes only when moral people of ALL faiths, all races and cultures bind together against hateful forces that seek to divide us.

Shukran...thank you. Connecting with you tonight at Family Night is especially fitting. We must do more of this...!






