## TEMPLE KICKS OFF ENDOWMENT CAMPAIGN WITH PARLOR MEETINGS – CAN YOU HELP?

The Boards of Temple Israel and the Foundation have initiated a campaign to build our endowment. We're calling it "A Campaign for the Next Hundred Years." We have begun an effort to publicize the campaign, including scheduling a series of parlor meetings with congregants, not to ask for money, but to be able to explain the campaign in a more intimate setting.

You may be asking yourself, "A 100 year campaign?!?! What the heck does that mean?" No, it doesn't mean we'll be campaigning for a hundred years ...even though it might seem like it. It means we're going to secure the future of our congregation, tying it in with celebrating our Centenary in 2024 – our 100 years anniversary of building the Long Beach Jewish community!

These are exciting times at Temple Israel. Since the successful capital campaign and remodeling of the building more than six years ago, membership has grown, with new families and kids joining our large (and ripening?) community of senior members (and everyone in between). We have also enjoyed several years of financial stability, thanks to the hard work and responsible planning of our senior staff and Board.

Now we want to ensure that the Temple community can thrive not just in the few years ahead, but well into the future – and so, as Joseph impressed upon Pharaoh, in these good times it's wise to reap and store some extra grain. What better time to plant the seeds "for the next hundred years"?

The Temple's endowment is essentially a "nest egg" – accumulated over many years largely through bequests from generous donors. These funds, managed by the Foundation – with current holdings of approximately \$2 million – are invested and generate income for the Temple beyond that of members' commitments or Torah Center fees. They supplement the operating budget, allow additional programming, and are available in case of emergency. Normally, only investment return (dividends, appreciation) is spent – the principal is not touched. But during financial "hard times" the endowment principal can be used to keep basic Temple functions afloat.

This endowment campaign is focused on several parts – the Temple Improvement and Preservation Fund (in Hebrew, Hiddur Mitzvah) to maintain the building; and three "chairs" to underwrite three key senior staff positions — those of Senior Rabbi, Cantor, and Educator. As each of these funds build, the monies they spin off will relieve pressure on the Temple operating

budget, which will allow more programming, scholarships, dues relief, etc. And if, and (as history has demonstrated, more likely) when the economy turns south, this nest egg will help us through any financial crisis.

The campaign is seeking both current donations and estate pledges. You might consider donations of marketable assets as well (stocks, real estate, etc.). If you have questions about donating, please contact Eric Shatzkin or any of the campaign committee members.

#### **CAN YOU HELP?**

You can be a part of this community effort. Most immediately, we are looking for additional volunteers to be involved in the campaign. Specifically, we're looking for families to host parlor meetings and otherwise "get the word out" to their friends in the congregation.

#### WHAT IS THIS SHUCKLING ALL ABOUT?

Earlier this year, we introduced a short educational segment into the RPC meetings to make them more engaging. For the October meeting, I volunteered to research and present on ritual movement during prayer.

My parents always referred to "bowing" and "bending the knee" as "davening." In fact, when I agreed to discuss prayer body movement, I titled this research "Davening." I was wrong! Davening is the Yiddish

word for prayer. Most of you probably know this, so consider my education as "on the job training." When I used "davening" as a search term in Google, the response was page after page of sites about Jewish prayer. The only site that came close to what I was looking for was an article from Berkeley Wellness that spoke of physical challenges that some people experience from body movement during prayer.

I consulted Rabbi Moskowitz and he introduced me to the term "shuckling," which according to the Reform Judaism website, "Wikipedia," is from the Yiddish word meaning "to shake". Shuckling is the ritual swaying of worshippers during prayer, usually forward and back but also from side to side. So, a new and effective Google search term..."Shuckling."

But what is this shuckling all about? Rabbi Rachael Klein Miller of Temple Emanu-El in Atlanta suggests: "We can trace bowing all the way back to our Tanakh. At that time it was likely a full prostration, and by the time it was talked about in the Talmud, it was generally a waist/knee bow. But still we wonder, why?"

The conventional wisdom is that shuckling is a sign of servitude and humility before God. We don't shuckle during all of our prayers, just at strategic times to demonstrate our devotion to God. For example, during the Bar'chu, our call to prayer when we proclaim that Adonai is One, we bow as we chant Bar'chu and rise while chanting Adonai. The leader bows during the first line. During the second line the congregation bows in response. The bowing is from the waist, unlike other times during the service such as the Amida, when we do bend our knees.

One last thing. When I worked at Raytheon, every day during lunchtime a group of Orthodox Jews gathered in a conference room for prayer. There was often a need for a tenth Jew to make a minyan and I was drafted to join them. One of them even kept a spreadsheet tracking how often they were able to gather a minyan (Rabbi, note the intersection of science and religion). I was amazed at the intensity of the prayer choreography that I now know to be shuckling. Some were pitching forward and back, some were rotating side to side (yawing to use an aeronautical term) and some seemed to be moving randomly. What might appear to a casual observer as a form of exercise may serve to increase concentration, while acknowledging reverence to Adonai. I now better understand their choreography.

#### **TEMPLE ISRAEL IN ACTION!**

This year, for our annual Rick Fahlk Memorial Food Drive, the food you brought went directly to those in need! Many thanks to all of you who participated through your donations, and a huge thanks to Paul Levitt for arranging for the truck and gathering the 'schlepping team', Rob Friedenthal and Harvey Friedman. Thanks to you, we collected 230 bags of groceries by Yom Kippur, and another 42 bags before the drive was over. The so-grateful recipients this year of the initial load of groceries were our neighborhood Emmanuel Church Food Pantry (6th & Termino), who serves a diverse population that includes veterans, disabled folks, and seniors, and We Care, a homeless prevention and support program that serves 160 families with children.

Following the end of food drive on September 30, the remaining 42 bags of groceries went to a newly discovered non-profit called Wrap The Kids. This organization works to have the homeless help the homeless. They come and make blankets which are then given to homeless children, or sold to raise funds to support them. Our bags of groceries disappeared that same day to the hundread of homeless who live in encampments under the 91 Freeway and the riverbed. We have isolated some ongoing opportunities to help them, so watch your Social Action notices for more information!

Jewish Yaffa and Arab Fatima are neighbors whose concern for each other during a date shortage provide a story with a subtle but timely message.

*Drop by Drop: a Story of Rabbi Akiva*, by Jacqueline Jules (PB JUL) The shepherd Akiva starts studying Torah at age 40 and becomes the great Rabbi Akiva thanks to the devotion and trust of his wife, Rachel.




