





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



SIMPLY AN UPDATE

Leadership and governance are so important and take so much time, that one often forgets to take the additional time to communicate with others about all that is going on. This is a very exciting time for TI as our new clergy settle in, more members join the congregation, and the latest pandemic surge slows down.

Evaluations and Goal Setting

With the help of the Personnel

Committee, we have set up a goal setting and evaluation system for the year for our clergy and staff. They in turn will be doing a similar system for those whom they supervise. We will be following the Jewish year starting after the High Holy Days. The President will be meeting with the Rabbi and the Executive Director separately, to set up goals for the coming year. Meetings will be set up twice throughout the year to discuss progress with these goals documenting that progress. In June/July, before major preparation begins for the next year's High Holy Days, a final report on goals with a summative evaluation will take place. We will have both paper and online storage for these documents to be passed from President to President and Personnel Committee Chair to the next. The Rabbi will be following this process with the Cantor and the Temple Director of Education whom he supervises. The Executive Director will follow a modified process as least once yearly for all whom he supervises. This system will bring us up to the standards of a Reform synagogue in 2022. We will be able to move ahead in a positive way and identify any issues that need work early on.

Bylaws

The Bylaws Committee has been working hard reorganizing, cleaning up, and modernizing our bylaws with advice from the Board, clergy, and staff. Any changes for the year must be presented to the Board 3 months prior to the annual congregational meeting. With changes for clarity and simplicity being the goal, there should not be any big changes this year other than the much needed addition of a Social Action VP. Social action is a huge endeavor in need of its own seat at the leadership table as we move into the future. Also, the question of opening Board positions to our non-Jewish members will be discussed with different groups over the next year to gauge where the congregation is at with this issue.

Strategic Planning

Rick Burney will be leading us in strategic planning over the next year, with the plan to set up our goals for the next three years. He is beginning to put together his committee and is consulting with the Board, clergy, and staff about his plans to proceed.

Services

The Rabbi will be reimagining the content and presentation of services. Particularly the second service of the month, where he and the Cantor will be trying out different modifications for approaching the liturgy. The B'nai Mitzvah service is also being slightly rechoreographed. There is a tentative plan to have teaching sessions on how to lead and teach Torah Study, and then maybe once a month have a lay-led study.

These are just some of the highlights of exciting reimagining of some of the things that we do. As always, any feedback is invited. Please remember in giving feedback to clergy, staff, Board members, and others, to remain mature and kind. Belittling or demeaning comments have no role in our place of sacred partnership. RPC MESSAGE

You know the old joke about the meaning of most Jewish holidays? "They tried to kill us. They failed. Let's eat!" This seems to sum up the story of Purim. But let's unpack this a little. Who are "they"?

There has been a lot of discussion in the past couple of years about using the word "they" as a gender-neutral singular pronoun. For many people this creates a discordant feeling. Other people are trying to integrate that into

their speech patterns with varying degrees of success. But in a way, we've been mixing and matching our use of the word for ages. When we look at Haman, "he" becomes the "they" who want to kill us. Similarly, Haman looks at the singular Mordecai and sees all Jews.

It is a struggle sometimes to have a strong feeling (positive or negative) about an individual and not ascribe it to a whole group of people. And conversely, we look at a group of people, but fail to see that it is made up of individuals with their own opinions and beliefs.

There is a story (adapted from an essay by Loren Eiseley) about a boy who walked along the beach at dawn throwing starfish who had been stranded on the shore back into the ocean. A man watching the boys says, "Why are you doing this? You can't save all the starfish that have washed ashore. What does it matter?" The boy answered, "It matters to the one I saved."

So, let's keep in mind that all of us are individuals and celebrate!

P.S. As "they" becomes used more and more as a singular form, are we going to start saying "they all" or "tha'll" to indicate plural?




WOMEN'S BOOK CLUB



Thich Nhat Hanh's Memory Is a Blessing By Roni Love, SCIC Member



On January 22 at the age of 95, the Venerable Thich Nhat Hanh took his last breath in Từ Hiếu Temple near Huế, Vietnam, after more than 39 years spent in exile from his native Vietnam.

He had spent those years utilizing and applying the tenets of Buddhism as a way to deal with

life's challenges. His teachings had a major influence on Western Buddhist practice, but his ideas were not popular with traditional Buddhist monks who kept out of public life and practiced their faith in monasteries.

During the '50's, as war was tearing Vietnam apart, Thich promoted deep listening as a nonviolent solution to conflict and sought to raise awareness of the interconnectedness of all elements in nature, advocating humanistic educational practices, health care and politics. He coined the term "engaged Buddhism" in his book *Vietnam: Lotus in a Sea of Fire.*

On June 1, 1966, Thich joined MLK, denouncing the war in Vietnam. That was the day we combined our efforts to work for peace in Vietnam and to fight for civil rights in the US. We agreed that the true enemy of man is not man. Our enemy is not outside of us. Our true enemy is the anger, hatred, and discrimination that is found in the hearts and minds of man, wrote Thich in "*At Home in the World: Stories from a Monk's Life.*" King later penned the Nobel committee, "I do not know of anyone more worthy of the Nobel Peace Prize than this gentle monk from Vietnam. He is an apostle of peace and nonviolence."

"In 1969, Thich Nhat Hanh led the Buddhist delegation to the Paris peace talks aimed at ending the Vietnam War. In lectures around the world, he drew on his studies of other religions to point out similarities between Buddhist practices and those of other faiths ... It's not my intention to convert Christians and Jews into Buddhists, he told The Washington Post in 1993. It's my intention to make them better Christians and better Jews."

"Every day," Thich Nhat Hanh wrote in his 1975 book, *The Miracle of Mindfulness*, "we are engaged in a miracle which we don't even recognize: a blue sky, white clouds, green leaves, the black, curious eyes of a child, our own two eyes. All is a miracle."

That miracle, holding us all together as one humanity, is very sorely needed today as we search for Salaam...Shalom...Peace.


