

PASSOVER

Passover has always been my favorite holiday. I was lucky enough to live near extended family as a child and we would all gather at my greatgrandmother's house for the seder. She would bring out course after course of amazing food: chicken soup whose matzah balls all floated, potato kugels with golden crispy edges, tzimmes with the sweet-tart taste of sweet potatoes and prunes, platters of home-made gefilte fish, and bowls of

charoset. (There were probably trays of briskets and chicken also, but I always preferred the side dishes.) She had spent the week cooking and the week before that scrubbing the house.

I've been thrilled to pass on many of these traditions to my children. We change out our protein, but we always have a tzimmes and we try out new charoset recipes each year. My chicken soup rivals my mother's, although I have not learned the trick of getting consistently floating matzah balls.

But I have always wondered, "Why do we spend so much time and effort to celebrate leaving in a rush?" Our matzah must be baked in 18 minutes or less. We must be vigilant about removing any foods with yeast or any product which has the potential to ferment from our homes. Why isn't the rule that we can only eat things that can be prepared quickly? I envision a week of peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, cold cereal, and cut raw vegetables.

But in our Passover celebration, we point out opposite situations: we were slaves then, now we are free; we rushed so much that our bread didn't have time to rise then, now we rejoice in spending time cooking; we were on our feet fleeing then, now we recline and relax at our table.

Just as we do in Hillel's sandwich, we eat bitter and sweet at the same time. Have a wonderful Passover celebration!

KOL <u>M</u>'YISRAEL / A VOICE <u>FROM</u> ISRAEL



To date in a new country is not just like having an exciting new variety of food; it is also navigating dating in a new language. A foreign language gives way to a foreign mindset. I am not referring to if we are actually speaking Hebrew with each other, for we usually speak English. Instead, it is that while English is native to my mind and thoughts, it is a translation of his native Hebrew mind and thoughts. In some ways, these two languages are

at polar opposites of many spectrums. While English is full of superfluous words added for politeness and nuance, Hebrew is really quite lacking in this category. This is true to the point where there is no actual good translation for "rude" in Hebrew. This is not to say that there is no such thing as rudeness in Israeli society, yet it is a language where you say what you mean, in an upfront and sometimes brutal way. You can put any doubts aside when an Israeli tells you something nice, but also be prepared to hear things said in a way no polite American would say.

In general, there is very little BS'ing in Israeli society. As you can imagine, Etay has offended my American sensibilities more than a few times. But that cost is small to pay compared to the familiarity allowed by that honesty. In Hebrew, a lot of details are inferred that are needed to be spelled out in English. Learning how to speak Hebrew is to learn how to speak concisely and directly, and learning how to speak it as a second language requires confidence and brashness. There are many times when I think that surely I have gotten my thoughts across, when in actuality the idea, hidden in the politeness and gentleness of English, comes through as gibberish or as if there was no intention to say anything at all. Translating before gaining true fluency where the syntax and personality of the language is native within you, is an arduous process where patience must be practiced, where many thoughts will be mistranslated by both parties.

It must be said, however, that the language possesses its own sense of beauty and poetry. In its curtness lies room for imagination. To leave things unsaid, instead of over filling every sentence with words, leaves space for the heart to practice instead of the mind. Etay is a passionate musician, and his serenades serve dually to woo me with beautiful music and also to introduce me to a finer variety of Israeli music. Diving into the lyrics and unpacking their mysteries is one of my favorite ways to both practice my Hebrew and to study the Israeli mind. Sometimes it's a little scary, if I must say, but usually a sense of humor and romanticism, hidden behind concern for everyday practicality, prevails. One of my favorite lyrics is, "Who will buy me avocado?" which the singer writes in a breakup song.

FOUNDATION MESSAGE

My name is Alan Lilien and I am the current President of the Temple Israel Foundation Board of Trustees. The Foundation is an independently incorporated organization whose sole purpose is to raise and manage funds to support the long term financial health and stability of Temple Israel. As an independent organization, we have our own bylaws which we review and update periodically. I am writing this message to inform the congregation of

our recently proposed bylaw changes, prior to requesting their final approval by the Temple Board of Directors.

The proposed bylaw changes include:

- updating our Board of Trustee nominating process and timeline to reconcile to our current operating procedures,
- added language regarding enhancement of donor relations, and additional responsibilities for the Vice-President to manage donor relations and outreach,
- updated language regarding telephone meetings to include audio and video conferencing technologies,
- updated the requirement for two (2) officer signatures for approval only on disbursements over \$2,000 (as opposed to all disbursements),
- general language cleanup, removing language no longer needed or language that duplicated our Articles of Incorporation.

journey toward justice and consolation.






