**Board Nominees** As we look at potential board members, our Nominations Commitee looks at candidates from different demographics and vaired skill sets. Kathy Kreida, long-time Temple member who has served on many temple committees, has watched her children go through our Torah Center, and is the spouse of a former Temple President. Leah Gerber, a new Temple member who has been very active in the greater Jewish community at Jewish Long Beach and the Alpert JCC for many years, with a plethora of connections and ideas. Lisa Hill, parent of a recent Bar Mitzvah, past committee chair of our HUM (TI PTA equivalent), and product of a rigorous Jewish upbringing.

Depending on the time of the year, the

Temple Board of Directors has different

priorities. This year with the bylaws

review, our last few meetings have

been dominated with fine tooling these

changes, to get them ready for the final

vote at our June 12 Annual Meeting

of the Congregation. Now given the

time of year, it is time to talk about

our budget and nominations to fill the

vacancies for next year's board.

### The Budget

Our next big item is creation of next year's budget, led by our Treasurer Jerry Levy, and his committee of experienced congregants in different aspects of finance. The budget is presented to the Executive Committee and the Board. It is adjusted based on feedback and finally voted on by the Board at the May meeting. The budget is then presented in detail to those who are interested during a meeting prior to our annual congregational meeting. It is then presented at the congregational meeting in an abbreviated form for information purposes.

Our largest expense items are staffing related, as we have contracts to maintain our Rabbi, Cantor, Educator, and Executive Director. Other salary expenses are needed to maintain our wonderful office staff, as well as our kitchen and custodial support staff. All these positions are very lean with everyone working at capacity and having to juggle priorities. Our other two larger budget expenses are associated with building maintenance costs, including necessary security and professional fees of various sorts, as well as

our Torah Center. These are just some of the major expenses. It is not inexpensive to run such a successful synagogue as Temple Israel. We are so fortunate to have top notch programming at every level, put together by our amazingly talented staff. This, of course, requires our extremely hard-working support staff inside of a secure well-kept facility.

How do we maintain all that we need to operate the Temple? Like all businesesses, we naturally need support. In our case, our revenue comes in the way of membership contributions and other donations. We ask that you always renew your membership at the highest level that you are able and comfortable maintaining. Remember, our policy is that we turn no one away for finanical need, so your generosity is needed to support our entire community.

Our most important fundraiser AND social event of the season is our Temple Gala. It really is an annual event not to miss! I was a member for several years before I realized that our excellent galas were not just an enjoyable, unifying social event, but also a major contributor to supporting our budget. Please attend the Gala this year on Saturday, May 14th. This year's looks to be a blast! (and outdoors - so COVID-safe, without risk of being canceled!). Also, strongly consider being a sponsor of some sort and help honor our pillar, through transition and pandemic, Executive Director Eric Shatzkin, as well as community and Temple leaders and philanthropists, Joyce and Hank Feldman. Lastly, let no item be unpurchased at our silent and live auctions.

### GARY AND JUDY COOPER



We are so pleased to have Cantor Cooper's parents, Gary and Judy as part of our Temple Israel community. We are extremely grateful to the Coopers for their generous bequest to the Next 100 Years Campaign. You may see them on Zoom or at Temple Israel, where they attend services every Friday and Saturday. They are very proud of Kelly and in their own words are "kvelling" each time they see her on the Bimah.

We asked Cantor Cooper to talk with them about their story and gave her some prompts:

• Why have the Coopers chosen to make a bequest to Temple Israel's Campaign for the Next 100 Years?

They hope that their pledge helps Temple Israel to flourish, and that it helps increase membership. They hope that it enables them to get anything that they need to move forward into the future. The values that are important to them are community involvement, Jewish education for children and adults, helping the needy, and helping to support the surrounding community.

Volunteerism and philanthropy are not new to Judy and Gary. Judy was a hospital volunteer and after retiring, she became very active with the JCC, the Jewish Federation and the Cancer League. Gary was active in Jewish organizations and as well as at Long Beach City College and Long Beach Memorial Hospital.

• We are so blessed to have you (Cantor Cooper) as our Cantorial Soloist. Is there anything they can tell us about how your journey has influenced or affected your family?

They have been very supportive and have come along with me wherever I have served: Palm Desert, Redondo Beach, and now Long Beach. When I started at Temple Menorah, they began to go to services on a regular basis, for Shabbat as well, which was new to them. When the pandemic hit, they started coming every Friday AND Saturday, which was also new for them.

This experience has reconnected them to their Judaism. When services were in person, Gary enjoyed hearing the congregants compliment him on his daughter. While they can only join online now, they are very happy that their daughter has returned to her and their spiritual home. They love seeing her on the bimah. • Tell us a little about their backgrounds, how they met.

Gary and Judy met when Gary was 17 and Judy was 14. They both went to North Hollywood High. Gary asked Judy out to a high school dance. She accepted, and the rest is history! Even though one went to UCLA and the other to USC, they stayed together.

• What Jewish traditions were important to them as they began their marriage and raised their family together?

They always told us that being Jewish was a very important part of who we were. They hoped to ingrain in them a feeling of pride that they were Jewish. Being Jewish was discussed a lot at home. However, while we were culturally very Jewish, we were not very religious. We only went to temple with on the High Holy Days. When the kids got older, we found a temple that they liked, and started going more regularly.

Passover and Hanukkah were special times for our family. We spent every Passover together with extended family. We always had a seder with Gary at the helm. Judy always made brisket that she cooked all day. For Hanukkah, the candles were lit and the blessings chanted every night for all eight nights. There were no latkes, but there was a gift every night.

• Do they have a favorite memory?

They have fond memories of going to Lake Arrowhead with their good friends, Joe and Susie Kalish. When the children came, they would take trips to Lake Nacimiento in a Winnebago. Judy remembers riding a motorcycle with Kelly in her belly on one of those trips. They took many family vacations together as their children grew up, and this tradition continued with all of their grandchildren as well.

• Tell us about their grandchildren and special times with them.

They have loved going to all the birthday parties for their grandchildren, and seeing three of their five grandchildren become Bar/Bat Mitzvah. Every couple of years, they would take their whole family-all their kids, spouses, and grandchildrenon a special vacation so they could have quality time together. Favorite trips include going to a resort in Mexico and several wonderful cruises.

Temple Israel has been the Coopers' spiritual home ever since they moved to Long Beach in 1988, and they were happy to be able to give a gift to an organization that is so meaningful to them.

They are very happy that Temple Israel has given their daughter such a warm reception. They are truly grateful that she has come home to the community that means so much to her.

I think our congregation feels the same way! Thank you to Judy and Gary and to Cantor Cooper for helping with this interview.

To end my mini-series on dating, so far, in Tel Aviv, I want to talk about how my relationship even came into being. If you've been keeping up with my adventures, you have probably started to become bored with hearing how fast life moves here, but, of course, dating is no exception. Etay and I met a month after I landed in Israel, and by the time my six-month program finished, I only had a few unloved items straggling behind in

my own apartment to be moved into his, and we had planned a two-week vacation together in Spain. In Tel Aviv it can seem like eveyone you meet is in a long-term relationship that was immediately and forever poised on the edge of marriage. If you made it past the first week with the person, you are definitely apartment searching with them. This fact is only supported by the city's housing market. As a nice Jewish boy from the American suburbs, reordering many stages of dating was not exactly an easy personal journey to accept. Tel Aviv can be a city of romance and amazing possibilities, but sometimes in the pursuit of pushing the boundaries, some good things are left on the way side. There goes my Hollywood notions.

At a certain point in our relationship, I had decided to make aliyah and stay in Israel. I originally wanted to return home, and permanently move after an appropriate length of time. After my program and European vacation ended, however, the new pandemic left me with many uncertainties. I could return back to the safety of home, but returning would become uncertain. On the other hand, I could stay in Israel, do the responsible thing of not potentially spreading corona, but would be stuck very far from all my support. The night before the flight, I felt very torn between my two options and what would be the outcome of either. Where would I go and what would I do? The man at my side told me where and what: to stay put. Unsaid, he also knew that he would be taking onto his shoulders the responsibility of someone who basically became a displaced person at that moment, stranded across the world and without the ability to work. As the situation worsened in the coming weeks, with border closures and severe lockdowns, his small apartment became my refuge from the world. There we went from two strangers dating, to bonded partners. Being stuck in a few hundred square feet with another person, with the cares of the world shut out on the other side of the door, can be a fairytale, even if the circumstances were tragic. Movie marathons, long chess games, culinary adventures, and deep conversations helped to pass the time, when we weren't hiding in opposite rooms trying to find a corner for ourselves.



Thursdays at 7:30 am





Muslims, Jews, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Baha'is and Hindus, for the first time in 30 years, will have celebrated the spring festivals (March to May) of Purim, Naw Ruz, Vesak Day, Holi, Ramadan, Passover, Easter and Vaisakhi; each falling within this three-month period, giving us a special opportunity to learn about and find commonality among our faith communities by lifting our spiritual and ethical awareness of each other's practices. I will focus on two current and upcoming holidays: Vaisakhi and Vesak Day.

Vaisakhi (April 13) marks the beginning of the Punjabi New Year. It also celebrates the birth of Sikkism as a collective faith, devoted to serving the One Creator and humanity. This ancient tradition, which began as a harvest festival, symbolizes prosperity, happiness and freedom - for all cultures and religions.

Vesak Day (May 15) is considered the most important Buddhist holiday in Southeast Asia and in the Theravada and Tibetan traditions. It is also referred to as Buddha Day because it celebrates milestones in the Buddha's life and spiritual journey. During Vesak Day, observers focus on three values: giving, virtue, and cultivation. Carrying out these values may include meditation, good deeds, or focusing time on recommitting to one's faith. Like many of the other holidays celebrated during this time, its date of observance is determined by a solar and lunar calendar, shifting year to year (like Jewish holidays), typically falling in April, May or June.

And in all this we speak in the name of the many Names our varied communities give the sacred One Breath, One Spirit that unites all life upon our beloved Earth. - Rabbi Arthur Waskow


