WHY WE DO IT!

Two of the TI Jewish highlights of last year took place on the same day. These were the Bat Mitzvah of Lilly Keiles and, later in the day, the Adult class B'nai Mitzvah. It was so important for Lilly to have her service at the Temple that she waited an extra year. TI had been such a home to her that leading service in that home was desired to make this most meaningful. I had to leave her celebration luncheon early to get to the adult service. To watch adults,

even in their seventies, leading a service after more than two years of study, is a very inspirational spectacle to behold.

This is a major reason that synagogues exist: to rejoice, confirm, and live our Judaism, from the becoming of a Jewish adult at age 13 to the importance of doing the same 60 years later because of a missed opportunity. This is why congregants step-up and lead, to help make experiences like this possible. With our recent gala, myriad of educational opportunities, Cantor recital, and Make a Difference Day to name a very few events – it is obvious why so many of us lead, govern, organize, do, and live a life of Jewish values.

What has your Board been doing?

Our last meetings have been involved in discussing and finalizing the budget for next year. We have also finalized and recommended changes to the bylaws that we will vote on in the congregational meeting. We have debated much the creation of a new VP of Social Action and the responsibilities of that role, as well as the chair of the Social Action Committee.

Did you know that every meeting we vote on accepting new congregants and hear about why congregants have resigned their membership (the most common reasons being relocation and death)? Every new member is vetted to be sure there are no red flags (this is exceedingly rare to never happens).

We will be planning our annual summer Board Retreat in order to team build, prioritize, understand the TI organization better, and hone leadership skills. We will be saying goodbye to some of our excellent VP's and we'll be welcoming new ones, as well as saying goodbye and welcoming new board members.

Our Covid Advisory Committee has been meeting monthly, even calling an emergency meeting, to determine an everchanging path forward to protect the health of our congregants.

What's up next?

Strategic planning for the next 3 years will be the focus of next year. Now that we have a new mission statement and revised bylaws, Rick Burney will be leading our strategic planning effort. There will be many focus groups to discuss where we should be heading, how to do this, and how to measure our progress. We will be discussing the possibility of revising our bylaws again to allow non-Jewish Temple members to serve on the board. We will be working on a policy and procedure manual for board governance and employee issues. Our social action footprint will be growing even larger over the next year. Most importantly, if your are called upon to be part of a group or to give an opinion PLEASE SHOW UP AND SPEAK UP! TI is all about what we want to make it!

SHAVUOT, THE LOW-KEY FESTIVAL

Passover includes days of cooking and cleaning, the seder, and 7-8 days of matzah. Sukkot has its bright fall colors and the temporary hut we gather in to eat and sleep for 7-8 days. And then Shavuot, the "other" pilgrimage festival has ...?

Like the other two festivals, Shavuot has roots in history, agriculture, and religious practice. Occurring 50 days (a.k.a. 7 weeks) after the Passover seder, it is one of the pilgrimage festivals

where all the Hebrew men were required to go to Jerusalem to make a tribute to the Temple. For the agricultural aspect, we officially celebrate the wheat harvest. Additionally, this is the earliest the people could bring the "bikkurim," the first fruits to the Temple. These are the items mentioned in Deuteronomy 8:8 - wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates.

The third aspect of Shavuot is the giving of the 10 commandments. Traditionally we think of this as the time that our relationship with God is formalized into the covenant. We celebrate by reading piyyutim (liturgical poems,) eating dairy (perhaps because we did not yet know the kosher laws of eating meat), and studying all night.

Ritualwell.org has several examples of contemporary piyyutim: Revealing Torah, revealing me; We all stood together; The Threshing Floor; and We still had far to go.

Wishing you all a joyous festival!

TREASURER REPORT

At the time of the writing, I can report that the financial state of the Congregation is excellent. We have received several extraordinary contributions that eliminated our projected deficit. That coupled with lower expenses due to the Covid induced reduction in facility use, we now anticipate a surplus of approximately \$26,000 for the end of this fiscal year.

The Budget & Finance Committee based next year's budget on projections from the previous years, modified by the higher-than-expected inflation numbers and the anticipation of greater use of our facilities, as we slowly emerge from the Covid cloud. Next year's budget will show a budget deficit, in line with our 10-year Sustainability Plan, of approximately \$60,000. All of this will be discussed in greater detail in the hour before the Annual Meeting, where I will be available to answer any questions you may have.

Finally, if you have been to a Next 100 Years Campaign Parlor Party and have already contributed (either in cash or a legacy gift), thank you! If you have not had the opportunity to attend one of these information sessions, please contact the office so they can match you up with one of the future Parlor Parties. Over the next 2 years, we hope that everyone will participate at whatever level is comfortable to help insure the future of Temple Israel for the Next 100 Years!

KOL M'YISRAEL / A VOICE FROM ISRAEL

Returning recently from California, Etay and I decided to make a layover in Amsterdam. Many of the cheaper flights stopped there; the city is a particular favorite of his, and I had not been. One thing about traveling as an "Israeli" is that we always seem to be prolific in the chosen getaway. In this small country, information on destinations, particularly shopping, partying, or leisure, quickly travels and, as such, the prices of flights

to the destination fall, creating a positive feedback loop, until basically we have annexed it. Amsterdam, while by no means an exclusively Israeli tourist Mecca, has certainly not escaped the flood either. But here I think, a draw, different than the previously mentioned ones, brings the Israeli tourist.

The connection of Israel and the Netherlands begins in geography and history. Both countries were situated on strategically placed trade routes, and as such were fought over, until recently, by much larger empires. After independence, an ethno-religious war divided both countries. In the case of the Low Countries, Catholic Belgium and Protestant Netherlands eventually reached peace with one another. As the Israeli-Palestinian is still yet to be resolved, I think the peace of Western Europe provides the first alluring glimpse into a potential future. Despite their strategically valuable location, the land it provided was certainly of a less desirable quality. The Netherlands, of course, having a major surplus of water, and Israel a major shortage. As the saying goes, "God created the world, but the Dutch created the Netherlands." Israel, in its own terms, turned its own swamps and deserts into forests, farms, and cities.

Amsterdam itself provides a vision of Tel Aviv, maybe a century in the future. While Tel Aviv replaces Amsterdam's canals with boulevards, both cities take pride in world famous café and nightlife scenes. In Amsterdam, every building is carefully planned in the city's unique style and well maintained. The city once suffered a severe traffic and smog problem, but aggressive government programs created the world's premier cycling haven. Tel Aviv, famous for its White City and eclectic palaces, has certainly failed on the maintenance front, but today boasts its own government programs to combat the neglect and encourage urban renewal. Cars have not gone away here yet, either, but every trip around the city leads to the discovery of another newly built bike path.

Tough landscapes led to pioneering spirits. Neither country has stopped with their terraforming efforts at their own borders but have become world leaders in dealing with their respective water crises. Whereas trade and markets became another Dutch specialty, fostered by their empire, military technology is a huge driver of the Start-up Nation. The Dutch are friendly but also gruff. In Amsterdam, many locals huffed at me for my improper

cycling, a favorite pastime passed along here in Tel Aviv to the suburban driver. The Dutch, I was told, are not known for their management skills (Hello Israel!), a trait proven to the unsuspecting tourist quickly at their respective airports.



SOCIAL JUSTICE BOOK GROUP

Every other Wednesday at 11:00 am June 15 and 29 (Zoom Only)

The Social Justice Book Group began in 2020 with a presentation by a local African American minister in response to the Black Lives Matter movement and the explosion of related (including Jewish and Latinx) social/legal justice activities and literature, much of it focused on presenting a more objective and fact-based American history. The Group selects, reads (in increments), and discusses books about these events, with a focus (similar to how many reform Jewish scholars study Torah) on how the issues confronted by these books impact us and what responsibility we might have, and how to address them in our own lives.
