THINGS...

Security

One of the most important duties of leadership and staff is providing security for temple members. Linda Burney will be chairing our reinvigorated Security Committee. On August 21st at least 10 TI members attended an Active Shooter Training Session sponsored by Temple Beth Shalom. They will be bringing what they have learned back to TI.

Another aspect of security is maintaining the health of our members,

specifically regarding Covid. Our Covid Advisory Committee, including doctors and nonmedical TI members, meets monthly and as needed, to provide guidelines for TI. The August meeting took place within two weeks of LA County coming out of the highest tier of transmission. One of the parameters reviewed are average cases over the last 7 days per 100,000. This is based on reported numbers which is greatly underestimated given that most people are doing home testing only. Because of the still very high prevalence of Covid it is recommended that, excluding Torah Center which is following school guidelines, everyone still remains masked within TI walls. Until the numbers decrease to a low-level tier, when the chances of sitting next to someone with Covid is very low, masks will remain a requirement. Though one might protect themselves wearing a mask, if the person next to you is unmasked, the double protection is lost. Threats such as Long Covid, prolonged symptoms, and death still occur. Let's all do our best to stay well.

Why?

Why as an adult are you a member of Temple Israel? Would you be a member if you did not have children at Torah Center? What would make TI matter for you separate from your children?

A recent article from the URJ (Union of Reform Judaism) asked parents why they had their children at Temple religious school. One parent responded with, "I want my son to feel connected to his community." Another said, "So my daughter has a safe space where she is embraced, accepted, and encouraged to be her authentic self." A third said they want their child to, "Understand what it means to be a mensch (a good person) and how to help make the world a better place."

The following questions were asked - This year we have a chance to awaken and ask:

- 1. What about Judaism and Jewish learning feels especially meaningful at this moment?
- 2. How can I share what I value about Judaism with someone starting a new year of Jewish learning? How can I remind them of the gifts of our tradition?
- 3. Who do I know who is involved in Jewish education, and how can I thank them for the work they are doing to help nurture our children?"

How would you answer these questions as well as the other 3 questions above? I would love to hear at president@tilb.org


The Board of Directors

RITUAL PRACTICES MESSAGE / NEXT 100 YEARS CAMPAIGN



GOD WAS IN THIS PLACE AND I DID NOT KNOW

Four snippets:

In Genesis 28, Jacob has left Be'er Sheva was on his way to Paran. In the evening, he picks a spot to sleep. He has a dream in which he sees a staircase or ladder with messengers of God going up and down. God appears beside him and says that this place would be given to his descendants. When Jacob wakes up, he says in wonder, "Surely God is present in this place, and I did not know it!"

Dr. Susanna Heschel shared a memory about her father, Abraham Joshua Heschel. "When he came home from Selma in 1965, my father wrote, 'For many of us, the march from Selma to Montgomery was about protest and prayer. Legs are not lips and walking is not kneeling. And yet our legs uttered songs. Even without words, our march was worship. I felt my legs were praying." (https://forward.com/opinion/212971/)

In her book, God in the Wilderness, Rabbi Jamie Korngold (also known as the Adventure Rabbi) quotes Rabbi Abraham ben Maimonides: "In order to serve God, one needs access to the enjoyment of the beauties of nature, such as the contemplation of flower-decorated meadows, majestic mountains, and flowing rivers. For all of these are essential to the spiritual development of even the holiest of people." Rabbi Korngold uses this as a jumping off point to find moments of mindfulness observing the world around us.

In Exodus, 25. God says, "And let them make Me a sanctuary that I may dwell among them." God describes in great detail what the structure and the decoration should look like.

So, what is the point of these four scenarios? First, there are many ways to connect to God: in the sanctuary, in a random spot when you are traveling, in nature, and when doing sanctuary. Basically, wherever you are and whatever you are doing can become a sacred moment. There is no one "only" path to a Jewish spiritual life.

Which leads me to my other point. There are many opportunities to get involved at Temple Israel: inside the building or in other places; indoors or out; using your words, or your hands, or your feet. With the New Year coming, this is a great time to check out the Ritual Practice committee or any of the other TI committees.

KOL M'YISRAEL / A VOICE FROM ISRAEL

One of the greatest things to do when you live in a bustling city like Tel Aviv is simply to... escape. On the rare occasions that you are presented with a car and the summer heat is still bearable... never hesitate! Find a few friends, put on your hiking shoes, pack the grill, and go.

After two hours northbound, the city is long behind you, and for a while the rolling hills and minaret adorned

towns of northern Israel have been your view. After descending the cliffs surrounding the Kinaret and climbing the other side, you have arrived in the Golan Heights. Standing here, traces of the political drama over these hills is scarce in one of the most verdant spots of the country.

Walking over the land, many dry bushes and burned patches of land dot the hot earth. In the distance, a ribbon of green nestles into a small dip in the land. Descending, you reach a lazy stream barely able to move through the thick reeds drinking thirstily from its waters. Here, you turn and follow its path. The shallowness of the valley is only a deception, for as you walk, you enter deeper into its fold, and soon "canyon" becomes a more appropriate name.

The thickets again disappear but give way unto the namesake of the "Hexagons Stream." The ground and walls became fractalized into thousands of polygonal stone pillars. In a natural basin, the water pools are clear and cool. Surprisingly sized fish bubble the surface. After changing from hiking to bathing clothes behind the privacy of a tree, you can jump from one of the columns into the refreshing waters (don't worry, the jump really isn't that high, and the water is deep). After some splashing and picture taking, the river continues.

Deeper it digs itself into the earth, and soon the path splits from its shores. The green of the trees follow the river descending below you, and above the walls you make a wide, winding loop, until it is your turn to descend again too with the river. In this deeper, more secret part of the river, a biblical oasis reveals itself. The roots of large fig trees gnarl the path, and their strong branches bridge overhead to close the small gap left between the canyon walls. On their branches gently dangle a small bundle of their fruit, still green in the early summer. In the filtered light, below your feet, small lizards dart. Myrtle and lander flowers provide anchorages for gathering bees and fragrance the air.

Around a last bend, in this Eden, I was not just writing when I said the troubles of Israel disappear in this place. On the shore, some kibbutznikim in their sandals and tank tops prepare Turkish coffee on a gas burner. A group of Orthodox school boys have a snack in the shade. And in the distance, in front of a magnificent waterfall, Arab children egg each other on to jump from higher rocks into the pools.

Discussing the Book, *The Convert* by Stefan Hertmans



In this dazzling work of historical fiction, the Man Booker International—long-listed author of *War and Turpentine* reconstructs the tragic story of a medieval noblewoman who leaves her home and family for the love of a Jewish boy.

What begins as a story of forbidden love evolves into a globe-trotting trek spanning continents, as Vigdis undertakes an epic journey to Cairo and back, enduring the unimaginable in hopes of finding

her lost children.

Based on two fragments from the Cairo Genizah—a repository of more than three hundred thousand manuscripts and documents stored in the upper chamber of a synagogue in Old Cairo—Stefan Hertmans has pieced together a remarkable work of imagination, re-creating the tragic story of two star-crossed lovers whose steps he retraces almost a millennium later. Blending fact and fiction, and with immense imagination and stylistic ingenuity, Hertmans painstakingly depicts Vigdis's terrible trials, bringing the Middle Ages to life and illuminating a chaotic world of love and hate.


TI's Rabbi Harvey B. Franklin Library DO YOU LOVE LEARNING, INFORMATION, AND BOOKS?

- Readers to share stories with our Torah Center classes (from 3-year olds through the 6th Grade) once school opens in Fall.



In July of 2016, Ruth Messinger retired as president of American Jewish World Service (AJWS), one of the world's foremost faith-based relief and development agencies. As its president "it is hard to overstate Ruth's contribution to the fight for lives of dignity and prosperity around the world. Her witness and unstinting advocacy for those whose voices don't always get the attention they should, have been an inspiration" wrote Robert Radtke, president of Episcopal Relief & Development, in 2016.

AJWS' contributions in this area are second to none. We are proud to partner with AJWS."




