

STRATEGIC PLANNING HAS BEGUN

Temple Israel strives to remain vibrant and relevant while honoring our traditions. To accomplish this, we must regularly evaluate who we are, where we see ourselves in the near future, and how best to stay true to our mission, vision, and values. Our past few years have included many transitions. We now have a great opportunity to establish how best to harness our resources and energies and forge a path that is exciting and meets the needs of our wonderful congregational family. A successful strategic planning process enables us to do so.

In January of 2023, a new Strategic Planning Committee was established to develop the next iteration of our strategic plan. An experienced consultant, David Levy, has been hired and already has helped to guide the work that we must do. In order to include the input of all our stakeholders (congregants, lay leaders, clergy and other staff) we will be holding focus groups and interviews as a mechanism to gather information. It will be impossible, of course, to meet with every congregant and complete this work within our established timeframe (by autumn 2023). 



KOL M'YISRAEL / A VOICE FROM ISRAEL

I came here to be a sojourner, a temporary resident simply gaining a taste of the ancestral homeland. But to simply visit a place so deep in the blood proved impossible, and the land captured my heart, and my future. The question of "How long?" transformed from six months into perhaps forever. I think it's obvious to anyone reading previous columns feel my love for this place.

One word hangs in the mouths of the people, blanketing the country in a despair, heard on the news and written in the headlines, shouted in the streets and discussed on the trains, debated at the lunchroom and whispered in the cafés, obsessed on in the waking hours and nightmares of the sleeping ones: "Reform." For the first time in two millennia, the Jewish people have regained sovereignty by realizing the State of Israel. We, as a people, have lived thousands of years in countries without rights and without liberty, living under brutal dictatorships who have oppressed us for political expediency. Every year at Passover, the deadline for "Phase I" of the reforms, we are commanded to think as if all of us lived under Pharaoh's rule, and that all of us were delivered from slavery. Metaphorical, yes; but also literal, as we list all the nations in which the Jews lived under oppression. My heart breaks as the nation races headlong into dictatorship, pushing relentlessly ahead the destruction of the judiciary, the destruction of the protection of any rights, and the concentration of power into the hands of criminals and Jewish supremacists. I cannot get the image out of my head of Natalie Portman, an Israeli Jewish actress, portraying Padmé Amidala in Star Wars: Episode III, declaring "So this is how liberty dies with thunderous applause."

While the ground shakes and darkness shrouds, the Knesset passes their agenda, and my own faith begins to feel eroded. As a gay man, as a liberal, as a Reform Jew, as an educated person, as a believer in peace, as a Democrat, the government has declared me their enemy. The government, led by and advised by people who spend all their days studying the Torah, versus me, who has never read the text in its whole. This government, whose supporters tears down Israeli flags on the Knesset floor, who posts yellow stars on businesses who support the protest, who attack Torah bearers for being of the "wrong" kind. How can their version of Judaism and their agenda be so adversarial to everything I believe in, to all the values and lessons of Judaism that I learned at synagogue, at camp, and at home, and still be Judaism: To respect all people, for we were all created in God's image; Tikkun Olam, to build a new Garden of Eden; To love your neighbor as yourself; To question and to learn, for we are Israel; Pikuach neffesh, for each life is a whole world.

With each passing reading in the Knesset, the aptness of the word sojourner returns.






WOMEN'S BOOK CLUB

Discussing the book, Becoming Eve by Abbie Chava Stein

The powerful coming-of-age story of an ultra-Orthodox child who was born to become a rabbinic leader and instead became a woman.

Abby Stein was raised in a Hasidic Jewish community in Brooklyn, isolated in a culture that lives according to the laws and practices eighteenth-century Eastern Europe, speaking only Yiddish and Hebrew and shunning modern life. Stein was born as the first son in a dynastic rabbinical family, poised to

become a leader of the next generation of Hasidic Jews.

But Abby felt certain at a young age that she was a girl. She suppressed her desire for a new body while looking for answers wherever she could find them, from forbidden religious texts to smuggled secular examinations of faith. Finally, she orchestrated a personal exodus from ultra-Orthodox manhood to mainstream femininity-a radical choice that forced her to leave her home, her family, her way of life.






Reform Roots and Resolve in the Reproductive Justice Movement




