KOL <u>M'YISRAEL / A VOICE FROM</u> ISRAEL

Since the announcement of the current government's agenda to reform the judiciary, thousands, and then tens of thousands, and then hundreds of thousands of Israelis have taken to the streets in protest. On a rainy Saturday, after the newly formed coalition announced their proposed judicial reform package, some 40,000 people quickly filled up Habima Square and overflowed into the surrounding streets. Most of the people here were veterans of anti-Netenyahu protests,

holding paraphernalia from the long running campaign. But for the next three months, as the government unrelentingly pushed forward even the most extreme points of the reforms, the consensus and the demonstrations against grew, with the umbrellas replaced by a sea of blue and white.

While certainly the requisite fiery speeches are delivered, booming over the background, something more unusual can be felt in the atmosphere. Many people describe it as feeling like Israeli Independence Day celebrations. In between the speeches, artists perform modern Israeli dance on the stage, and drum circles beat away on the street. Major popular musicians perform songs of hope and the beauty of the land. Vendors push their way through the crowd as parents buy bagels for their children. Together the crowd, hundreds of thousands, sings Hatikva. Despite being one of the country's largest and most sustained protests, violence has not marred them. The people are here to celebrate and fight for the Israel they believe in.

In a dramatic 48 hours this week, Netenyahu fired his defense minister after he warned against the security risk the reforms were causing. In the middle of that night, over 500,000 people spontaneously took to the streets. The next morning a nationwide strike was called, as people headed to demonstrate in front of the Kenesset. For hours, as Netenyahu continually delayed giving a speech, we waited. Even in this moment of intense anger and fear, the spirit of the movement persisted.

Recently, when two Temple Israelites were visiting Israel we met up at a wine bar on Nachalat Binyamin, a trendy pedestrian street intersecting Rothschild Boulevard. They pointed out that their trip started out in Europe touring Jewish communities that are no longer. Around Israel they toured many impressive historical and religious sites but still in the perspective of looking backwards. But here, on this street, they saw today's Israel. Young people were celebrating with contemporary Israeli pop music played loudly. On the walls was street art in Hebrew. We were sitting just a block away from the city's main gay bar. And going between the bars a group of Chabbadniks lit Hannukah candles and sang with the revelers.

The protests represent something very similar to me. Jews of every sort are there to make their voice heard. In a rare moment for this country, leftists and rightists stand together. Gays and religious conservatives stand together. Tel Avivis and Peripherniks stand together. People who had never protested before and veteran protesters stand together.

- Promotion: Actively promoting our organization and supporting our staff.
- Service: Serving on at least one committee with the goal of chairing a committee or sub-committee within two years of board membership.
- Greeting: Acting as a greeter and/or Board Representative at Services a minimum of four times per year and at the High Holy Days.
- Support: Staying current with all personal financial commitments to Temple Israel.
- Fund Raising: Actively support fund-raising events of the Temple.

A WARM EMBRACE: REFUGEE SHABBAT

Heartfelt appreciation filled our sanctuary at the Refugee Shabbat on March 10th as we welcomed Afghan and Ukrainian refugees who courageously spoke about their experiences. Shabbat music laced with poetry and Jewish teachings on welcoming the stranger filled the service. The CEO of HIAS (Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society) has said "We used to help refugees because they were Jewish; now we help refugees because we are Jewish." Joe Goldman, Western Region Director of HIAS updated us on policy changes and challenges and encouraged us to engage at any level we can. HIAS has been supporting refugees since the 1880's. That could include many of our forebears! Joe announced exciting news, that JFCS Long Beach/West OC is on the verge of taking on a major new role in supporting resettlement through HIAS. Trip Oldfield, CEO of JCFS, revealed more details of the plans.

Two Afghan women, Reema and Masoma, who have been resettled with help of the NCJW HIAS Welcome Circle described their individual journeys and demonstrated their admirable progress in learning English. They discussed their professional and personal development over the past 11 months. They continuously acknowledged the importance of the constant support of the Welcome Circle and other supporters here in their success and they were gratified to becoming independent women. Members of the NCJW Welcome Circle from Temple Israel include Gail Levy, Cynthia Gordon, Natalie Swit, and Michele Samit.

The two Ukrainian women who spoke are dear friends who met in law school in Ukraine 20 years ago. Zhanna joined her family, who had left the USSR as Jewish refugees with the help of HIAS, in the U.S. shortly after that. Oksana built her life and career as an attorney representing children and others in need of guardianship in Kyiv. The two were chatting on the phone when the first explosions were heard a year ago.

Zhanna translated Oksana's remarks into English for her to read. Oksana described how, after enduring months of the sound of explosives detonating all around them, a winter with sporadic heat and lights and living in fear, she decided it was time to take her 14 year-old daughter to safety. After barely a month in the US, she is keenly focused on learning English so that she can find work, and helping Anastasiia adapt to 8th grade at Rogers Middle School. Their HIAS Welcome Circle includes Kate Sachnoff of Temple Israel and several other Jewish neighbors who have banded together with Zhanna to embrace Oksana and Anastasiia as family. They are raising funds to help cover rent and other expenses for the family.

DIVERSE SOCIAL ACTION INTERESTS IN OUR CONGREGATION

Over 100 congregants responded to the Social Action Survey that was emailed out in December of 2022, offering their perspective on priorities for issues the Temple should address, methods of advocacy, and their interest in participating.

The TILB Mission statement reminds us that "With a view towards Tzedek (justice) and our concern for the world we will leave to future generations, we embrace Tikkun Olam (repair of the world)." The survey was conducted to gain and understanding of the Congregation's specific interests and assess willingness to engage in action towards social policy and direct service goals that can help repair our world.

Antisemitism and hate crimes ranked as the highest concern, with reproductive health, gun violence prevention, racial justice, domestic violence/child abuse/trafficking, homelessness/ housing, and environment occupying the next highest tier of concerns.


Approximately 80 percent of respondents felt that the Social Action Committee should impact these issues through collecting goods, donating funds, or fundraising to support effective organizations working on these issues, and/or educating the congregation on the issue. Approximately 60 percent of respondents supported educating lawmakers and policymakers on the issues (within the bounds of 501c3 religious organization regulations) and/or providing volunteers to offer direct services. A full 51% said they are willing to write letters or postcards on issues and approximately 40 percent said they would make phone calls or send emails to elected officials, participate in family friendly social action activities, research information, or collect or donate needed materials.

Fifty percent of the respondents replied that they are 65 or older, the rest spread fairly evenly among other age categories.

In discussing these results with the Board of Directors, we noted the high response rate and level of willingness to engage. The issues interests and methods endorsed are diverse, leaving room for the Social Action Committee to zero in on items that are timely and attract volunteer leaders.







INTERFAITH GREETINGS Centering The Heart And Wholeness Of Latino Jews

Intercultural as well as interfaith speak to the diversity that has been my passion for many decades. This month I take the lead from Ariela Ronay-Jinich, a Jewish Latina researcher, offering her insights into Jewish community building centered on Latino Jews...many of whom are members of Temple Israel.

[°]Ronay-Jinich wrote, "It became very clear to me that I had reached my limit of how long and how far I had compromised my Latino, Mexican identity as a Jewish professional." She noted that after entering parenthood, she now felt a heightened awareness that rarely, if ever, was Jewish programming intended for her or her family. "So, it really hit me that I had to create it for my family." And she had the academic and activist background to do it. Supported from both the Rodan Family Foundation and Jewtina y Co. and fiscal sponsorship from Bechol Lashon and Jews of Color, she partnered with community members to create a monthly havurah and other culturally specific programming through an initiative called Olamim: Latinx Jewish Belonging for Families.

For many of the participants, concerns about cultural erasure fuel their motivation to pass traditions, culture, and language down with intentionality. Many express grief about things that aren't available in the community, such as Spanish-language Jewish programming. "The stakes feel very high in terms of what they transmit and how. People are handing me their heart. They're talking about their children, their identities, their families. It's so personal. It's really el corazón—the heart—of who they are.

"Our hope is to find out who our allies are. But our sense of community is not dependent on that. That makes it feel possible... We can have programming and spaces where we generate what we're hoping for."

Ronay-Jinich is excited about focusing and disseminating her findings to help create an impact for Latino Jews, in the Jewish and Latinx communities more broadly, and for Jewish families navigating their intersecting identities in general. "This is an opportunity for institutions to learn and reflect. I'm excited that this work is really about people because that's an element often missing from racial justice work. I get to be in the heart not just of their grief, or strategies or behaviors for coping, but in the heart of peoples' empowerment. My hope is that this work can help Latino Jewish families enjoy who they are—together!"

Let us, as part of Temple Israel and the Reform Jewish community, take heed and open up even more possibilities of inclusion because that is what we stand for; that is what we are here for; that is who we are.
